#### ❖ Dr. K. Kalyani Swapna, Associate Professor (Communication Expert – English)


The main role of Communication Expert from English department in this orientation session is to

- Offers training inputs on soft skills, professional communication, and academic writing where needed.


# **❖** Dr. Ch. V. Aruna, Associate Professor (Senior Faculty – FED)


